#### Birchwood

This Part Q approved new house in the countryside was based on the conversion of agricultural steel framed cow sheds. The house incorporated PV panels, battery storage, geothermal heating system and a number of technological systems with the aim of the client to absolutely minimise energy consumption. An open plan minimalist design incorporated large open areas with underfloor heated polished concrete floors and white plastered walls. Externally clad in Siberian Larch with a zinc standing seam roof system. A wonderful new home in the countryside.

# **Old Hall**

This project consisted of demolishing an extension and replacing it with a large new kitchen, guest room and ensuite to an existing Grade II listed building.

#### **Shelley Hall**

This project was the refurbishment, extension, alterations, improvements, and repairs to a wonderful Grade II listed home. The project included complete new services installations, extensive structural repairs and lime plaster repairs internally and hot lime additions to the external brickwork. A 'Crittal Window' zinc roofed extension created a new family living area ready for the next generation of the owning family.

#### **Christmas Hall**

The Christmas Hall project was a large scale re-modelling refurbishment and extension to a substantial Georgian listed property in Bildeston Suffolk. Built as a rectory in the nineteenth century, the house had, in recent times, been used as a wedding venue and a self-catered short term let, amongst other things. The current owners took on the substantial commitment to turn the property back into a family home.

The work included reroofing and structural repairs. The existing sliding sash windows were fully refurbished, the interior was remodelled, rebuilt and decorated throughout. The extension is a glass walled structure under a Sarnafil roof and provides a complete contrast to the original building.

## **University of Essex**

We have been on the University of Essex maintenance framework for seven years but have a 30 year association with the University.

Our framework site manager is based at the main campus and has his own office and compound with a team of many multi-trade workers.

We are also on the University of Essex construction framework where we have carried out several larger projects. By having a place on both frameworks, we have developed a workforce with considerable knowledge of the University's estate, which means that we can offer a high value and flexible service.

Our latest project for the University of Essex was a full refurbishment and reconfiguration of the 1st floor of the Gateway Building at the Southend campus.

We have created a new space which is home to a nursing lab comprising a drugs prep space, teaching station, four nursing beds with full nurse call system and new monitors with each. Two therapy teaching stations, one community living space with a peoples hoist and surrounding consultation rooms and offices. The dental space now includes twenty six phantom head practice chairs and surrounding consultation rooms.



#### Со-ор

One of our largest customers is the East of England Cooperative Society (Co-op).

We cover an exceptionally wide range of work for the Co-op across Essex and Suffolk from large multi-million pound schemes through to responsive maintenance, planned maintenance and emergency call out work.

One example is the work at Peartree Road, Stanway which included replacing gutters, drain covers, repairing walls, and resurfaced in places.



#### Edme

We have been involved with the development of the Edme site for over 100 years from the original boiler house and chimney shaft through to the Mistley waterworks.

We have completed many new build and refurbishment projects to keep the buildings and site in compliance with current food production legislation.





## **Crisp Maltings**

Crisp Maltings in School Lane replaced the seven original traditional maltings buildings in Mistley for malt production.

We have worked the buildings since their construction, carrying out maintenance, repair and improvement works.



# The Manse

This was a two storey extension to create a new entrance, stairwell and ensuite bathroom together with a new porch to the back of the house.

We remodelled the first floor, replaced bathrooms and created a magnificent master bedroom with the carpentry carried out by our own craftsmen.

#### Milestones, Swan Basin

Our small works team installed two beautiful milestones next to the Swan Basin, Mistley. The two milestones, which have been installed thanks to a community effort, allow residents to see the distance between the village and London. The one on the left of the basin is the original Mistley to London milestone, dated approximately 1750, which was originally sited halfway up Mistley Hill, and in the mid-19th century was moved to Mistley Quay.



Until recently, it was situated behind Thorn Quay Warehouse at Mistley Quay, and when the warehouse was demolished in 2018, the milestone was removed and stored safely, pending re-siting.

The white cast metal marker is a replica of a milestone made at Bendall Foundry in Lawford and was also originally sited further up Mistley Hill. The milestone is shown in the André and Chapman map of Mistley, drawn in 1777.



## Yeoman Close, Ipswich

This project was to repair a four storey block of 32 flats damaged by fire and water. Our 24/7 team were called out initially to a fire which broke out in a top floor flat and spread along the roof. The subsequent dousing by the fire brigade caused significant water damage throughout most of the flats in the block. We carried out work to make the building secure and replaced the roof and then secured the tender to rebuild the internal structure of the building.





#### CareCo New HQ, Braintree

A new headquarters and distribution centre for CareCo, an independent distributor of care mobility products.

The centre is a high end, energy efficient, modern office, based over three floors, including a call centre, canteen, training room and break out rooms. #### **SEERS Medical**

Built in the Deben flood plain the building is 'stooled' to allow water to flood under the building in the event of an emergency. The extension creates a new manufacturing and warehouse building to the rear of the existing warehouse and assembly buildings, including block paved carparking. This is a live site therefore our site team are diligent around ongoing day to day activities by the client, including material deliveries and forklift moving of materials.

#### Long Wyre St, Colchester

Refurbishment of a former Co-operative Store which included the remodelling of three storeys and basement to produce seven retail units, one restaurant and 24, one and two bed flats for social rent.

The main challenge for this project that our site team overcame was that the building was in the town centre on the corner of two streets, Long Wyre Street and Culver Street East with neighbouring retail businesses and the general public using both roads for pedestrian access to the adjacent shops. #### Wakes Hall, Colne Valley

## Rocheway

## **Cannock Mill**

It is also a key requirement to keep the essential character of the building. To achieve the airtightness required for Passivhaus craftsmanship and attention to detail is absolutely vital.



2021 was an outstanding year for the Rose Homes for Life team. Despite ongoing economic disruptions, property performed better than ever before, with record levels of demand and sales across all our developments.

## Lawford Green

Our leading development at Lawford Green is continuing at a pace, and with 180 completions it is very much a community.

Eight of these homes were completed for the charitable Lawford Housing Enterprise Trust, a scheme designed to help tenants make the first step towards owning their own property.

The development consists of 21 individually styled house types across 440 homes, providing a mix of two, three, four and five bedroom properties.



















# **Painters Place, East Bergholt**

Painters Place is an exceptional collection of ten highly detailed, single-storey new homes, set within easy reach of the village centre facilities.

These luxurious new homes are specifically for the over 55's. The first completions are due in the early summer of 23.





## Nun's Green, Great Yeldham

Our latest development of 33 stunning two, three and four bedroom homes are set around an expansive, landscaped green. Nun's Green is in the centre of the rural village of Great Yeldham on the northern Essex/Suffolk border.

Thirteen homes will be provided to Flagship to be let either at affordable rent, or sold as shared ownership properties.

## Barleyfields, Weeley (Phase 2)

Having secured the outline planning approval, we have recently submitted the reserved matters planning for 280 homes, of which 84 will be affordable, a new primary school, an early year's nursery, up to 3,000 sqm of office space, public open space and a new pedestrian footbridge.



#### King's Orchard, West Bergholt

A collection of two, three and four bedroom homes in the heart of the charming village of West Bergholt.

We are currently working with a neighbouring landowner to amalgamate three allocated land parcels in two separate locations in the village to deliver a fully integrated and coordinated scheme of new homes.







## Chambers Place, Bures St Mary

Full planning has been granted for the redevelopment of the former Chambers bus station, in the picturesque village of Bures (St Mary), Suffolk. The redevelopment will see the creation of 10 new homes and a new convenience store, built in a style that will respect the conservation area and nearby listed buildings.

## King's View, Woodbridge

King's View will comprise a mixture of stylish apartments and houses set within landscaped grounds overlooking the river Deben. The development will replace the former Suffolk Coastal Council offices, in Woodbridge which have laid empty for six years, with nearly 100 homes. These will include apartments, houses and penthouses. Demolition of the offices is now underway.

King's View is ideally located to take advantage of the extensive facilities and amenities that this beautiful and vibrant market town has to offer.



## **The Atlantic Nomads**


## **Queen Elizabeth II**





